

BLUE-EYED GRASS

Sisyrinchium angustifolium

This member of the Iris family makes a great low (under 1 ft.) grass-like ground-cover that sports broad masses of 1” blue flowers profusely in early April. It performs well in sun or shade but prefers some relief from hot afternoon sun during summer months. For massing purposes, plant 4” pot specimens 18” apart. It pairs well with Leavenworth’s Coreopsis
